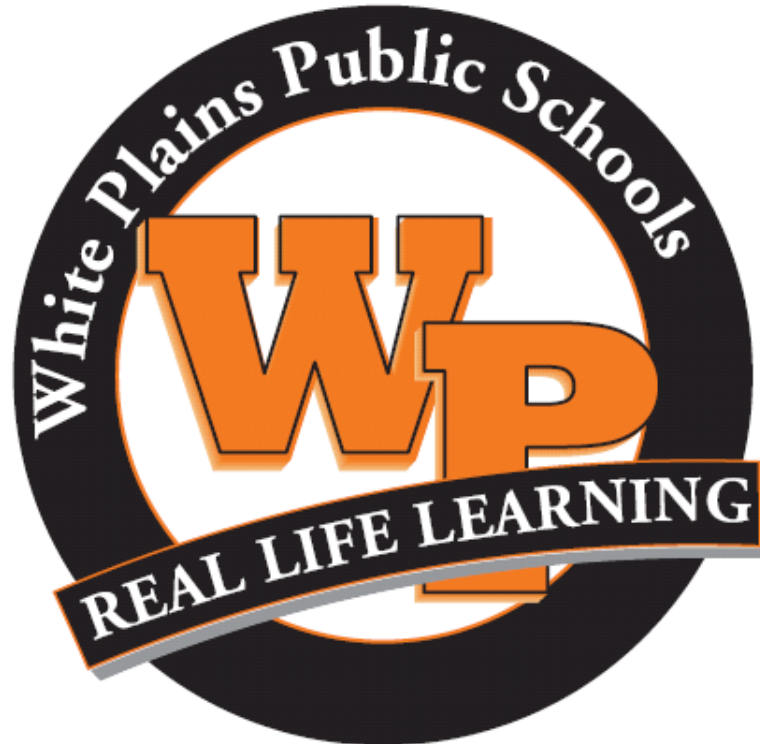

The 2010 White Plains Secondary Summer School will be in session from July 13 to August 19, 2010. Class instruction is geared to Regents remediation and attaining credit in failed classes. High school students not residing in the White Plains City School District who wish to attend remedial classes on a tuition basis may register after first receiving written approval from the appropriate authorities at their home school.

Dates: Summer School will be in session four days per week, Monday* through Thursday, from 8:05 a.m. to 12:15 p.m., beginning July 13, 2010. There are two periods of instruction, each period lasting two hours. Summer School will be closed on Fridays. **Regents examinations** will be given over a three-day period, **Tuesday, August 17 through Thursday, August 19.**

**Note: The first week of summer school classes will be held Tuesday through Thursday*

Second period: 10:15 a.m. – 12:15 p.m.

Eligibility: White Plains Summer School is open to:

1. All students who are eligible to attend school in the White Plains City School District. **Students who are residents of White Plains but do not attend public school must provide proof of residency (see below) on the day of registration.**
2. Qualified students from any school district may attend, provided class size does not exceed the number desirable for instructional purposes. A limited number of spaces are available to out-of-district students. Only high school classes are available. **There are no Middle School Summer School courses available for students who are not White Plains Public School Students.**

Practical exam scores, IEP's and 504 Plans must be provided at registration for students who require accommodations.

Fees: All fees must be paid at the time of registration. Please make checks payable for the exact amount to: **WHITE PLAINS BOARD OF EDUCATION.**

1. **White Plains High School and Middle School Students and all White Plains residents:**
 - Registration Fee -- none
 - Each Regents and/or RCT Exam Only -- none
2. **Non-resident students:**
 - One Course -- \$305.00 + \$5.00 registration fee
 - Two Courses -- \$600.00 + \$5.00 registration fee

Proof of residency:

Homeowners: Signed closing statement or deed **and** recent utility or phone bill

Renters: Lease signed by both parties **and** a recent utility or phone bill

When parent(s) and student(s) live with a friend or family member: Notarized Residency Affidavit (available from Student Information Center) **and** lease signed by both parties or signed closing statement or deed verifying the residency of the friend or family member **and** recent utility or phone bill

Enrollment:

In order to be able to enroll for a course a student must:

- I. Complete the two-page registration form included in this bulletin (current White Plains Public School students should see their guidance counselors for their registration forms). Please ensure that your guidance counselor reviews the form and that you have selected the correct class(es) and examination(s). Out-of-district students must have an authorized person from the school that they currently attend approve all forms. That person's signature (your guidance counselor or building principal) must appear at the bottom of the application or the registration form will not be processed.
 - The registration form must be fully and accurately completed and signed by an appropriate school representative and parent/guardian.
 - Courses and period preferences (when there is a choice) must be listed on registration form.
2. Complete the Examination Information portion of the form if you are registering for Regents or RCT examinations and not the corresponding courses. **Note:** Only White Plains High School students and White Plains residents will be permitted to register to take a Regents and/or RCT exam without also registering for and taking the corresponding course during summer school.

Registration:

Please adhere to specific registration dates, times, and locations.

Students must register for Summer School in person.

Once classes begin, permission from the principal or administrative assistant is required to change classes or to drop a course. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE.** Students must bring a written note from their parent or legal guardian before such a request will be considered

REGENTS EXAMINATIONS

- All students enrolled in a course are eligible to sit for the Regents and/or RCT exam associated with that course
- All White Plains High School and White Plains resident students who passed a course but failed the Regents associated with that course and who wish to register just to re-take the exam in August should register at the Summer School Office on July 13, 14 or 15 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (White Plains residents only)*. Please note that students who take the course have a far better chance of passing the Regents in August than students who just sit for the exam. **No student will be permitted to take a Regents Exam in August if he/she has not pre-registered for the test.**

**Non-resident students will not be permitted to take any August Regents Examinations unless they are enrolled in that class in the White Plains Secondary Summer School.*

MATH COURSE DESCRIPTIONS FOR GRADES 9 – 12

Algebra

This course follows the NY State syllabus for Integrated Algebra. Topics include algebraic concepts such as writing, solving and graphing first and second degree equations, as well as probability and statistics. The final exam for this course is the Integrated Algebra Regents Exam.

Algebra 9

This course is the first year of the two-year study of the NY State syllabus for Integrated Algebra. Topics include algebraic concepts of writing, solving and graphing linear equations, and statistics. The final exam is a local final.

Algebra 10

This course is the second year of the two-year study of the NY State syllabus for Integrated Algebra. Topics include the algebraic concepts of factoring, quadratic functions, data analysis and probability, exponential and radical functions and rational expressions. The final exam for this course is the Integrated Algebra Regents Exam.

Geometry

This course follows the NY State curriculum for Integrated Geometry. Topics include analyzing geometric shapes and relationships, informal and formal proof, transformational geometry and coordinate geometry. The final examination is the Integrated Geometry Regents Exam.

Geometry Applications

This course focuses on the “big ideas” of Geometry with an emphasis on applications of geometry. Topics of study include geometric relationships, making and investigating conjectures, transformations and coordinate geometry. The final examination is a departmental exam.

Algebra 2 Trigonometry

This course follows the NY State curriculum for Integrated Algebra 2 Trigonometry. Topics include the study of rational, exponential, logarithmic and trigonometric functions as well as probability and statistics. The final examination is the Algebra 2 Trigonometry Regents Exam.

Algebra 2

This course is the first year of the two-year study of the NY state syllabus for Integrated Algebra 2 Trigonometry. Topics include the study of rational expressions, linear, absolute value, quadratic, exponential and logarithmic functions. The final exam is a departmental exam.

Math B-2R

This course continues the study of topics in the Math B curriculum including a continuation of the study of rational, exponential, logarithmic and trigonometric function. Since the Math B Regents is no longer being offered, the final exam will be the Algebra 2 Trigonometry Regents Exam.

Algebra 2 Trig Applications

This course focuses on the “big ideas” of Algebra 2 Trigonometry with an emphasis on applications. Topics of study include algebraic, quadratic, rational, exponential, logarithmic and trigonometric functions and their applications. The final exam is a departmental exam.

REQUIREMENTS FOR SUCCESS IN SUMMER SCHOOL

Daily Attendance

Summer School will be in session 4 days per week, Monday through Thursday, for 24 days. Each day of summer school is roughly equivalent to seven days of regular school. A student who is 17 minutes late for class has missed the equivalent one day of instruction during the regular school year! Summer School is very structured and intense. Class participation is up to 50% of a student’s grade. In order to be eligible to attain credit and pass their classes, students must be in attendance and on time every day.

Transportation

The School District does not provide transportation for Summer School. Students and parents are responsible for getting students to and from Summer School.

Rules and Regulations

The WPPS code of conduct is in effect during all secondary summer programs. All students will be provided with a summary of the code upon request and given an opportunity to ask questions regarding enforcement. The following is not fully inclusive of the code, but please be aware that:

- **No smoking is permitted anywhere on campus** and will result in prompt disciplinary action.
- **Appropriate dress** is expected in all Summer School programs. Revealing attire are such as short shorts, tube tops, etc. are not permitted, nor are clothes that display inappropriate, obscene or otherwise distracting logos. Students in violation of this policy will not be admitted into the building.
- Student drivers must **obey the speed limit on school grounds** and park only in designated areas.
- Students MAY NOT go to their cars during school hours EXCEPT to leave for the day.
- **No visitors are permitted on school grounds or in classes for any reason.**
- **Graffiti will not be tolerated.** Respect for school property is essential.
- Fighting, vandalism, and/or other episodes of inappropriate behavior as well as the possession or use of weapons, illegal or controlled substances, including alcohol, will not be tolerated. Violations will result in suspension from Summer School and legal action will be taken.
- **Students are only permitted in areas of the building used for instructional purposes.**

Failure to abide by these rules may result in disciplinary action including expulsion from summer school.
