

# **DR. KENNETH W. TROUT**

Dr. Kenneth W. Trout, Class of 1943, was a distinguished internist and cardiologist and a leader in the Westchester medical community for more than 40 years.

After graduation from White Plains High School, Dr. Trout served in the European theatre at the conclusion of World War II. He graduated from Wesleyan University in 1948, New York Medical College in 1952, and was an intern and resident at Grasslands Hospital in Valhalla.

He began practicing Internal Medicine in White Plains in 1958 and earned Board Certification in Cardiology. Dr. Trout's caring manner and his ability to listen and communicate well earned him the admiration of his patients.

He was on the attending hospital staffs of both White Plains Hospital and St. Agnes, and, at St. Agnes, was President of the Medical Staff (1974-75), Director of the Department of Medicine (1983-1988) and Chief of Cardiology (1984-1992). St. Agnes recognized his years of devotion and contributions by naming the Non-Invasive Cardiology Laboratory for him.

Dr. Trout was also active on the staff of The Westchester County Medical Center where he was Assistant Chief of Cardiology as well as a Clinical Associate Professor of the New York Medical College. He also served as President of the Westchester Academy of Medicine and the Medical Society of the County of Westchester.

In addition to his professional career, Dr. Trout was active in the community. For 26 years he was a trustee of the Memorial United Methodist Church and found time to also be a scoutmaster in The Boy Scouts of America and a member of the Board of the Visiting Nurse Service in Westchester. He was also a member and president of the Westchester Chapter of the American Heart Association and an active member in the Rotary Club of White Plains.

Dr. Trout and his wife Alice had four sons, all of whom graduated from White Plains High School.
