

# **DR. STEVEN J. CORWIN**

Dr. Steven J. Corwin, Class of 1973, a cardiologist and internist by training, is Chief Executive Officer of New York-Presbyterian Hospital, the largest hospital in the United States.

At White Plains High School Dr. Corwin played the clarinet in all three musical groups – the Band, the Orchestra and the Symphonic Band – and was a member of the National Honor Society.

He received his undergraduate and medical degrees from Northwestern University, graduating *summa cum laude*. He came to New York-Presbyterian Hospital, then known as Columbia-Presbyterian Medical Center, in 1979, and has been there for the past 33 years.

After Dr. Corwin completed his internal medicine residency and cardiology training, he was named to the faculty of the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1986. He joined the Medical Center's management team in 1991 and from 1998 to 2005 he was Senior Vice President and Chief Medical Officer for the newly merged New York-Presbyterian Hospital. He then served as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer, responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations across all five campuses, including the Westchester Division in White Plains, and for advancing the Hospital's mission, *We Put Patients First*.

In September 2011, Dr. Corwin was named Chief Executive Officer of New York-Presbyterian Hospital which, with 2,409 beds, is the nation's largest not-for-profit, non-sectarian hospital. It has nearly two million patient visits a year and more than 6,000 doctors and 19,000 staff. His responsibilities include moving the Hospital into the future with emphasis on enhancing electronic information systems, promoting community health and participating in the national discussion about health care reform.

Dr. Corwin is a Fellow at the New York Academy of Medicine and has been the recipient of the Hope and Heroes Award and the Health Care Industry Good Scout Award, among many others.

Dr. Corwin's brother and sister graduated from WPHS. He lives in Manhattan with his wife, Ellen and has a son and a daughter.
