

Transportation Proposed for 2018-19

- Based on the rerouting and ridership analysis, the District will:
 - realize efficiencies by reducing the number of buses needed to transport its students
 - maintain estimated bus loads of approximately 44 students
 - maintain ride times of no more than an average of 35 minutes
 - increase safety, due to fewer vehicles on the road and on school grounds during arrival and dismissal
- With voter approval, these efficiencies will allow the District to institute transportation for our **high school students** who reside more than one mile from White Plains High School. No parental fee will be charged to students.

Transportation Proposed for 2018-19 (cont.)

- Under State Law, voter approval is required in order for the District to transport high school students who live more than one mile from their schools.
- The associated additional cost, including the impact of eligible private school students, is estimated at \$166,000 annually.
- This cost is anticipated to be offset by the savings realized through the reduction in buses needed, per the transportation analysis.
- **If the Proposition is approved by the voters, the “parental fee” for high school students to ride the bus will be eliminated.**

Proposition #3: Transportation for grades 9-12

- Resolved, that the Board of Education of the White Plains City School District is authorized to provide transportation within the boundaries of the City of White Plains to students in grades 9 to 12 who reside more than one (1.0) mile from the school which they attend within such boundaries for an estimated annual cost of \$166,000.00.
