

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

WPSD cleaned 20 catch basins within the reporting period. WPSD approach to operations includes the conduct of daily inspections of district grounds to monitor that they are in state of good repair. During these inspections, findings are entered into the digital work order system, and work orders are automatically generated to address any detected areas that need maintenance. WPSD prohibits the use of fertilizers and pesticides on all district lawns. WPSD utilizes brine for roadway maintenance which uses up to 25-30% less salt than utilized traditional road salt for de-icing. WPSD's salt storage is in containment in a shed with a cover and is stored until it is needed for de-icing activities. WPSD stores solid waste outdoors in containers that have lids. Additionally, the We Future Cycle program helps create nearly waste-free schools by implementing robust recycling program. Maintenance and repair of WPSD's bus fleet is done by outside contractors at an offsite facility. WPSD utilizes the special protocols in place for storage and handling of hazardous waste.

WPSD will continue the conduct of daily inspections of district grounds to monitor that they are in state of good repair and utilize the work order system to address any detected areas that need maintenance. WPSD will continue the following: prohibit the use of fertilizers/pesticides on district lawns, utilize brine for roadway maintenance and store salt in a shed with a cover, store solid waste in containers that have lids, implement a robust recycling/composting program, maintain and repair its bus fleet at an offsite facility, and utilize the special protocols in place for storage and handling of hazardous wastes. As a long term goal, WPSD is considering food composting in collaboration with the County and City, and is considering organic lawn management.
